IBDP UPDATE

Dear Parents/ Guardians,
Greetings,

Time flies.... How else can I explain the month which has just passed by? A big thanks to every member of the extended TIS family for making me comfortable and giving me a wonderful opportunity of shaping the destinies of these talented students.

My immediate professional goal at TIS is to ensure 100% diploma results for the batch of 2016. My team is all revved up to achieve the same. You will receive periodic updates from my office about the measures taken to ensure your ward achieving their personal best. The following are the actions taken last month based on student's feedback.

1. A hostel work schedule has been created and implemented where in a student gets one marked hostel work per day with at least two or more working days to submit the same.

2. Students will be writing a monthly assessment test at every fourth week wherein the test will have a portion of what has been taught in Gr 11 as well as the content taught in the previous 3 weeks. This has been done to ensure periodic revision of the content taught in Gr 11 and prepare

students to face the final exams with confidence. Syllabus for the test will be shared with the students in advance.

3. The internal assessment submission calendar has been reworked in such in a manner wherein there are detailed process based deadlines for each subject instead of mentioning the date for final draft submission. I have also ensured these deadlines are placed in a calendar format ensuring students have a clear picture of deliverables from their end every week. I will share the same with parents and guardians also.

4. We are adopting managebac (<https://tis.managebac.com>) as complete curriculum delivery monitoring portal for IBDP, parents/ Guardians will have access to all the critical information pertaining to their ward's progress on managebac. Parents/ Guardians having difficulty in accessing managebac can contact me for regularizing their access to managebac.

5. Batch of 2016 will be processing their college applications this semester, to facilitate this we have given a two hour slot per week for the same. You can find this time mentioned as CART (Counselling and Research Time) on the time table. In addition to this my office has identified the free time slots of students in the academic week and has shared the same with academic staff and career guidance staff, for them to schedule their interactions without affecting their academic schedule.

6. Extended essay is the next area which has been regularized, Gr 12 will meet their supervisors every week on Thursday between 4 and 5 PM under my monitoring and

supervision. We had the first such session last week and the student feedback of the same is encouraging.

Looking forward to your support in ensuring a wonderful DP experience to your ward and molding them into life-long learners who think globally and act locally. Global citizens who will carry with them the ethos of TIS while living the IB learner profile as **Principled, Balanced and Open-minded knowledgeable communicators and thinkers**, who are **caring inquirers** and smart **risk-takers** (the ones in block letters are the IB learner profiles...) .

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CAS UPDATES

New Students orientation –: New students and student's leaders were welcomed into the New Year with an orientation, followed by a trip to Prampram. They were engaged in a cleanup exercise, football match, games and a bonding time. In TIS we create opportunities for our Student leaders to develop their leadership skills and bond with their peers. *We show empathy, compassion and respect. CAS/CO-CURRICULAR

activities for the semester: We started on a good note; students have been engaged in a variety of activities after school. What's new? **Taekwondo, Swimming Club and Zumba Classes.** The enthusiasm is contagious on Campus! Let's encourage our children to be engaged and challenged.

IB1 CAS new guide: CAS is a Core component of the IB program. Even though points are not awarded, an IB student who does not meet the requirements of CAS will not be awarded his/her IB Diploma. The New CAS guide has been rewritten with more clarity. Clear emphasis has been made on the 3 strands of CAS, and guidelines for CAS have been made more evident. The following items outline the changes:

- ✓ CAS renamed **Creativity, Activity and Service**
- ✓ Learning outcomes reviewed and rewritten, there are 7 outcomes instead of 8.
- ✓ CAS activity renames CAS experience
- ✓ CAS Journal renamed CAS portfolio
- ✓ Greater guidance on reflection provided – Reflection is a very important aspect of student's experiences.
- ✓ Introduction of a CAS cycle for service learning: The stages are:

Investigation, Preparation, Reflection and demonstration of results.

- ✓ CAS no longer dwells on hours or points scored; however there is the need to show evidence of one's involvement and achievements. Duration of CAS is 18 months. Self-initiated projects and at list one project with the 3 strands of CAS is a must. At the end students are asked to present a concrete evidence of their experience: a performance or product.



Health walk: Coming up on the 12th of September, starting point TIS gate 1(Hostels gate) through Community 22. All parents are encouraged to support their wards' color group (**Yellow Outeniqua, Green Wisteria, Blue Cedar, and Red Kigelia**). There will be light refreshment after the walk, a great opportunity to bond within school community

Color Group assembly: On the 7th of September new students and staff will be welcomed into their Color Groups - **Yellow**

Outeniqua, Green Wisteria, Blue Cedar, Red Kigelia. New criteria for points will be adopted this academic year. Math, Singing, Sports Inter color competitions are coming up. Make sure you get your color group Shirt and cheer your color on.

Fun Fair – The Comeback: The IB 2s and IB 1s are sharing a common project while doing the TIS Annual Fun Fair. A range of activities will be happening on campus with the aim of raising money for a project in aid of Children with Congenital Heart disorder. Parents of the IB classes and school community are encouraged to support this initiative. More information in the parent's bulletin.

Service learning - IB trip. The IB 1 will have their first Service learning trip on the 19th and 20th of September. The students will be engaging in a range of activities such as; Literacy classes, teaching the students of the Graceland Academy in Akorlikope; designing teaching aid materials for the Classrooms; making blocks and painting the classrooms; cooking; etc. This is another opportunity for collaboration with the Akorlikope community. More details will be sent to all parents of the IB 1 Class.

Student Initiated Projects

Akorlikope Water Pump: Derek Bonsu (IB2), on one of his visits to the village of Akorlikope for the **'Liter of Light'** project, came

across a borehole (constructed by Alumni of TIS) which was out of service due to a broken pump. Realizing that the pump could be restored to continue to provide clean water for residents of the village, Derek took the initiative of seeking funds for the purchase of a new pump. With donations from family, friends and the African Regent Hotel (major sponsor), Derek has been able to raise an amount of: Gh¢ 10,000.00 for the purchase of the manual pump (pump cost of: Gh¢ 7,750.00) which has already been installed and will be commissioned on Thursday, 3rd September 2015. A shed will also be built over the pump to protect the people from the hot sun. TIS students taking initiative and making a difference. Derek, the TIS community is so proud of you!

Emmanuella Kukua Bennin (IB2) CAS project: Emmanuella has realized that schools are being built around the country. She has also become conscious of the fact that the kids, for whom these schools are built, actually lack proper clothing and stationery to encourage them to attend classes. It is therefore against this backdrop that she is eager to make a difference by donating clothes, shoes and books to the school children of Akorlikope and other communities. Let's support Emmanuella's initiative by donating items such as: Used cloths, books and stationaries. Kindly drop your donations in

Liter of Light Ghana is a sub-unit of the **Liter of Light Organization in USA**. The NGO plans to supply homes in rural areas with eco-friendly, sustainable and cost-friendly lights. It is a very simple mechanism and the main tools needed to make these lights are bottles, water and bleach. The device functions like a deck prism and its ability to work is explained by the physics Law of Refraction. To supply light in the evenings however, we need a small solar panel which costs Gh¢ 350.00 per unit.

A pilot run was held at the end of July and the outcome was amazing. The team plans to extend their project and provide 100 homes with these lights by December.

The project was founded by TIS Alumni namely; **Elikem Tettey Tamaklo, Abraham Asante, Hornam Kumahor (IB Class of 2012), Elom Tettey Tamaklo (IB Class of 2015), and Adjoa Kwakwa (IG Class of 2012)**, while the logo of the **Liter of Light Ghana** was created by **Ambavi Longe (IB Class of 2012)**. Students from the current IB 2 and IB 1 classes are fully engaged with the project.

Thank you all for your massive support last Visiting Sunday; an amount of Gh¢ 2,577 was raised towards this project. Thumbs up to Mr. Alex Tay and Mr. Richmond

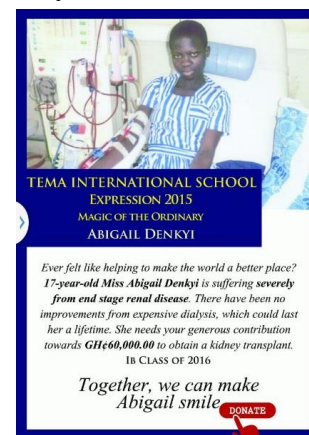

The set up for the evening will be a satirical nightlife in the streets of Tema and Accra without any electrically powered form of illumination nor sound. With lanterns and other forms of light source, the evening will be characterized by live acoustic music, games, and street wise

snacks like kelewele, fried yam, coconut juice, roasted corn and plantain etc. All this will be organized by the students with support from the teachers.

School Play Audition: School play audition: Coming up on the 13th of September. Students will be involved in a range of activities to showcase their creativity in music, dance and drama.

This year the TIS Drama Club is staging: **SARAFINA, by Bongeni Ngema** - Sarafina is a story based on the struggle for freedom by the black majority in Apartheid South Africa. Set in Soweto, Sarafina, a young black South African school girl battles with her friends to understand the concept around freedom; what it means to be free as well as what it takes to be free. The thematic concerns around “freedom” will be interrogated and showcased in this energetic and highly versatile production. It is a total Theatre full of music, dance, drama, design and spectacle.

Recital Colloquium

This year’s Recital Colloquium happening on the 18th of September is going to showcase a mix medium of recitals. There is going to be blends of genres and artistic expressions, creatively couched and exhibited by our students. It is a platform created to allow students explore their talents in a mini concert by performing pieces of compositions to the school community. This has also been a tool to build the interest of students

in music and to propel them towards their coursework. Over the years, solo and duet performances on various instruments have been featured as well as ensemble performances.
