Unfortunately, some/many G12 parents will receive an account after I June for the replacement costs for these lost items. Responsibility certainly saves money.



Exeat

There are two types of exeats: general and medical.

All students will be allowed two exeats each mid-semester. Please plan accordingly to avoid disapointments.

All exeat requests must be completed online and submitted with at least 48 hours' notice, with the exception of urgent medical issues. Weekend exeat requests must be received by the preceeding Wednesday. Any requests after this deadline will not be approved.

The integrity of an exeat request is critical.

No exeats will be granted if a student has outstanding work.

No exeats will be granted during the last week before a semester break.

Parents/Drivers must show the approval exeat from their phone to enter (NO SHOW. NO GO!)

Students must return by 5.00pm on Sundays (weekend exeats).



General Exeat

A general exeat will cover passport and visa matters, as well as family events. These must not exceed more than two per mid-semester.

Medical Exeat

A medical exeat will cover medical, dental, optical, and hospital appointments. When possible, appointments should be made for Saturdays, to minimise learning loss.

A medical exeat is for the same day departure and return. Otherwise, it is a general exeat. Requesting a medical exeat with a departure on Friday and a return on Sunday is a weekend (general) exeat.

Service as Action **Eating Disorders Presentation at Assembly**



Tricia Minlah and Louisa Ayem from MYP 4 presented on eating disorders at the last Assembly. They shared valuable information about our relationship with food with the school community. According to their research, the common types of eating disorders include:

Anorexia nervosa: This is when someone tries to keep their weight as low as possible by not eating enough food, exercising too much, or both.

Bulimia nervosa: This involves an unhealthy eating cycle of binge eating followed by purging to compensate for overeating, such as vomiting or taking laxatives.


Binge Eating: Where someone eats excessively in a short period of time in an out-of-control way and feels compelled to do so regularly

Some possible symptoms mentioned include;

- Eating very little food or eating large amounts of food in a short time in an uncontrolled way
- Having very strict habits, rituals or routines around food
- Spending a lot of time worrying about your body weight and shape
- Avoiding socialising when you think food will be involved
- Deliberately making yourself sick or taking laxatives after you eat
- Excessive exercising- this might involve exercising when not physically well enough to do so or feeling guilty or anxious about not exercising

They emphasised the importance of speaking up and talking to someone, especially our school counsellor, should anyone experience a problematic relationship with food. Furthermore, members of the school community are encouraged to have at least three good and balanced meals a day to provide the body with the right energy.
